ACSD School Meal Debt Payoff: Special Offering December 8, 15, 22, 24, 25 & 29

Special Offerings will be held at the above worship services to help pay off school meal debt for the Ames Community School District (ACSD). Like 75% of school districts in the United States, ACSD has unpaid meal debt. Families' inability to pay for school meals is becoming an increasing problem. Thankfully, lowa schools are prohibited from singling out or shaming students with unpaid accounts, and although the USDA spends more than \$24 billion each year on child nutrition programs, it prohibits schools from using federal funds to pay off meal debts. Each summer, ACSD sends uncollected school meal balances over \$100 to collections. The negative balance on school breakfast and lunch at ACSD is at \$46,937.02 as of the date of this printing.

Advent Offering ELIMINATE AMES LUNCH DEBT GOAL: \$47,000!



Currently there are 575 students who pay for lunches with negative balances. Of those students, 52 receive reduced cost meals and 195 receive free meals (their negative balance is due to a la carte items such as snacks or extra milk).

Collegiate-Wesley has set a goal to pay down 100% of this debt over the advent season. Help us reach our goal of paying down this debt so that at a time when many hardworking families are struggling to pay for food and educational funding is hurting, keeping Ames preschool through 12th grade students fed during the school day, so that they can focus on learning, is not such a burden on our schools or families.





Intergenerational Small Group: In Light and Darkness

The inspiration for this study comes from the common usage of "light" and "darkness" during Advent, and from exploring how the earth experiences both the very lightest and darkest days with summer and winter solstices during Advent. Scripture focusing on God's light has led to the belief that light is the source of goodness and hope. This belief implies darkness is not wanted or needed, it is something to banish or get rid of, or



God is not even present in the dark. Through this study, we will reimagine our understanding of darkness, primarily how Christianity heavily relies on the binary construct of light as good and darkness as bad. We will examine how light and dark exist together in balance, not opposition, by considering what can light possibly mean without dark.
