Message from Pastor Mary

We live in a noisy culture in which much talk clamors for our attention. What's more, many of us also love to talk. And when we read the Bible, we learn that God love to speak too. Yet, God doesn't just drone on in the same way as us. God speaks to God's people in many different ways. In the Old Testament God spoke through a flood, through promises, through prophets, through earthquakes and even in the "sound of silence" or sometimes translated, "the still small voice." When we are out and about in our lives, sometimes we hear God speaking to us in a sunrise or a bird calling or the quiet of the forest. Maybe we hear God speaking through our children or the voice of a friend or even in our daily devotionals. But God spoke most decisively to us and to the world in Jesus. In Hebrews 1:3 Jesus is called, "the radiance of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's being." The Scripture tells us that Jesus was with God at the foundation of the earth, and yet, Jesus comes to be with us, to walk with us, to comfort us, to challenge us, to help us do the right thing. Jesus Christ comes to share God's very self with us to remind us that we are a part of God's eternal story. The story that never ends. God speaks to us in Jesus, and we should pay attention. Because in that Word of Relationship lies strength, courage, faith and love.



We are preparing to hear God speak again to us during these days leading to Holy Week and Easter. On April 3rd, the Rev. David Weesner will bring the message based on the hymn How Great thou Art. I have known Dave for many years - for seven of them he was my District Superintendent -- and I can tell you, you do not want to miss his sermon. He is an exceptional preacher and will allow us to hear a word of God to us.

On April 10th, Patrick Gagnon will lead us on Palm Sunday with a selection of hymns to celebrate this entry into Holy Week. We will also have the Palm Parade during the morning worship. On Maundy Thursday, April 14th at 7 p.m., we will gather around tables in Wesley Hall to commemorate the Last Supper. This will be a moving, and meditative service. We will have a service of hand washing within the service and you will have an individual small bowl and towel to take part. On Good Friday, April 15th at 7 p.m. the Chancel Choir will be with us as we go through seven readings that walk us to the Cross. The music will take us into the deep place of recognition of the cost of God's love for us. Please be there. We all need to remember again the story of this sacrificial act.

Easter Sunday, April 17th, we will lift our voices at 9:00 and 11:00 with the great anthem of the faith, Christ the Lord is Risen Today. We will rejoice that death is never the final word, that God's love and goodness reaches beyond the grave to embrace us in eternal life and hope. We lift up together the knowledge of the ways Christ continues to call us, to gather us and to send us for the transformation of the world in love and justice.

On April 24th, we will conclude our series of Songs of the Heart with Hymn of Promise, one of my personal favorites. Please join with us to celebrate the promise of new life, the promise of Christ with us and the promise of our belonging to the Beloved Community.

About Guys Night Out



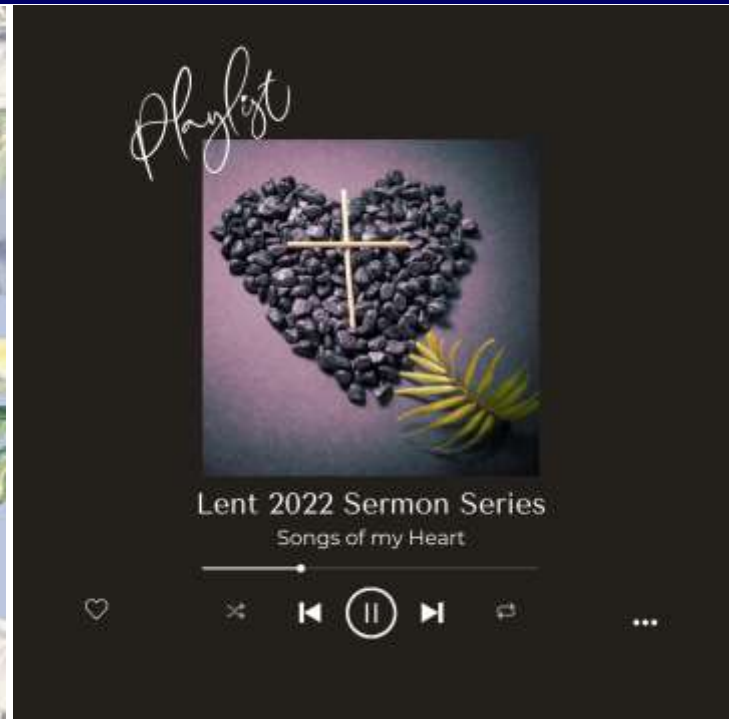

Update from C/W Tactical Team

NEW MASKING POLICY

Beginning April 1st, Collegiate/Wesley will no longer require masks but strongly encourage mask-wearing in our facilities. Small groups and other groups are encouraged to make masking decisions based on the various needs of the group. The Tactical Team asks that if you are feeling sick, please stay home. Digital worship will continue to be offered each week. The team will continue to monitor the positivity rates and CDC recommendations.

You are encouraged to enter the building using the West, South, or North doors. The East door will remain locked. We are so thankful for the ways we can continue to take care of one another and worship together.

Finance Committee

As many of you are aware, CUMC/WF has had a contract with David Orth for several years through which he has provided fundraising expertise to the church. Until recently, that contract was managed by the Endowment Board.

In the most recent renewal of David's contract (January 1, 2022), management responsibility was moved to the Finance Committee. While many of his efforts under this new contract will be similar to those he has provided in the past, this change broadens the scope of his position to provide support for fundraising throughout the church and Wesley Foundation. The Finance Committee has established a subcommittee to work closely with David to develop priorities and strategies for his efforts.

Through his work as Director of Generosity, David has played a key role in the financial affairs of CUMC/**WF for many years. As the church moves forward to find the "new normal" beyond the COVID-**driven stress of the last two years, the Finance Committee is delighted to collaborate with David in his newly redefined position.

Trustees/Security

It has come to my attention that some of you may not understand the reasons the Trustees have implemented stronger security measures at the church, both in the main building and at the Annex. Since the main building was reopened last summer, we have seen an influx of people coming into the building with weapons or who have sought to vandalize. The policy that the Trustees developed and enacted to secure the building with electronic locks and security cameras was encouraged by myself and in consultation with the staff who work in the building. The purpose is to increase safety not only for the staff, but also for anyone who is in the building. Any of our members who wish or need to access parts of our building can fill out a short form and receive a key card that will allow them access to areas closed off to the general public. This policy means that when members of our church, or other guests, are anywhere in the building, they, too, are safe. The west door and hallway remain open to the general public with use of a restroom, benches to sit, and a public computer. Additionally, at the door to the Office Suite/hallway, there is a doorbell and intercom. So if you were to need to come into the office, you can ring the doorbell and talk to Janelle through the intercom and she will let you in.

This last week, we had to alert the Ames PD of one person in our building who entered the west hallway and began to pull things off the wall and act in an erratic way. The previous day I assisted a man with housing and later received a phone call that he had been arrested for domestic abuse with a weapon and drug trafficking. These are just two of the most recent incidences. I share this information not to alarm you, but to explain why we need to take our security seriously. We are dedicated to keeping our staff safe, our members safe, and our visitors safe when they are on our campus. Thank you for understanding.
