Message from Pastor Mary

Perhaps for us as we prepare for Christmas, entering into the Advent season, there is an unspoken, silent hope within us that we will experience anew the change that happened in the world when a child was born and history was never quite the same. It was not the same for Joseph and Mary or any of the others who were there. Not for the friends Jesus found and made as he grew older. Not for the men and women who were his disciples. Not for those down through the ages who have felt him come into their lives. One of the **Advent scriptures reads: "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither** the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of **Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24: 36**-37).

But coming he is, and for us who live on this side of the first Christmas and this side of the first Easter, we believe that He had indeed come. And we know that encountering him is just how the Gospel writer said: one minute

you are going about your business as usual and the next minute you feel the mystery and healing of God with you.

The time of Advent and Christmas says: He is coming for you again, like he did the first time, like he will whenever we open ourselves to the hushing gentleness of a mother with her baby in a drafty stable or the new found strength of a young father who is determined his untimely child will survive into greatness for the world. He is coming like He did so long ago and we are asked to wait and watch for his coming as we open up ourselves to God. We are asked to wait and watch, knowing that the moment of His arrival into our lives will be unpredictable and un-staged. But when he comes into your life, you will see Him and perhaps if you look up just at that moment you will see a star light the sky and it will feel as though the light has come just so you personally can see, just so you personally can know the holiness of your life wrapped up in the life of Jesus.

I hope you will join us at Collegiate/Wesley this Advent all the way to Christmas Eve when we light candles and sing Silent Night and know again how He comes into the world, into our world. I hope you will **be present as we worship with Lessons and Carols, enjoy the Children's Pageant, spend some time in** Nichols chapel during our Blue Christmas service remembering those whom we have lost over the years, and maybe even find your way to the sanctuary for storybooks and hot chocolate on Christmas morning. All in order to say with our lives and our hearts: He has come again into our lives to love us and teach us how to love.





The second fencing project that was comopleted was over at Wesley Place, The previous fenced-in playground for the preschool had left a corner in the North West isolated and cut off. It was deemed that it would be a better use of space to square off and expand the fencing to increase the usable space and allowing the preschool to obtain even more credentials. To help keep costs down, part of the old fence pickets were cleaned up and used to picket part of the new fence. Both of these fences turned out great and were a great way to wrap up the outdoor projects.

Especially with all the colds and viruses going around, it is good to have multiple people to help out. has helped welcome 9 families including 15 adults and 7 children ages 4 to 14 from Ukraine to the Ames area. The children are attending Fellows, Sawyer and Gilbert Elementary Schools, Gilbert High School, and Ames Middle School. The families come from several different cities in Ukraine and many have left family members at home. Several of the adults are studying English with volunteer tutors and through DMACC ELL classes. Some have found employment. Two families have recently moved to their own rental units from their host family homes. AIRA has raised funds to pay initial living stipends, transportation,

initial housing costs, and government application fees. This Advent season we at Collegiate Wesley would invite you to give a special holiday gift to AIRA to assist in welcoming more individuals from Ukraine to the Ames area and also assist in sponsoring individuals that are already here.
