This April as we approach Easter, we may need to ponder the meaning of this poem a bit: how it is we live **in a world where the stream “sings in the crease of the hill” knowing nothing of death while we humans bring death upon ourselves through our wars and pollution and the desire “to belong only to ourselves.”** It's certainly an interesting thought, that if we turned our minds and hearts toward other people and the life of the world, we would eradicate so much needless suffering and death. It is this turning our minds and hearts that Jesus invites us to that welcomes us into the Resurrection, a resurrection that promises **us a way to live forever in God's love.**

When we celebrate Easter here at Collegiate United Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation, we believe that we are called to live lives that rise from the slumber of indifference. We believe we are called to share love and life with others whoever they may be. We believe we live this way because God in Christ **has put that in our hearts and minds. The God who showed us in Jesus' that love triumphs.**

We invite you to be with us this Easter season: on April 2nd we will celebrate the Parade of Palms for Palm Sunday. We will gather around tables in Wesley Hall at 7 pm on Maundy Thursday, April 6th, to commemorate the Last Supper and on Good Friday, April 7th, we will have a service of readings and music to begin also at 7 pm. Then, Easter morning at 10 am on April 9th, we will celebrate again the Resurrection!

Communion will be offered three times during April: On Palm Sunday in our 10 am worship service, on Maundy Thursday in Wesley Hall at 7 pm and on Easter Sunday, April 9th at 10 am.

After Easter Sunday, we enter into the season of Eastertide in the Church Calendar. During this season **we will be studying the Gospel of Luke every Sunday, using Adam Hamilton's new resources: Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws.** Be with us in fellowship, community and worship.


Sending to Serve

Lenten Special Offering—One Last Push Before Easter

Students can face challenging and unique barriers throughout their experience **working towards a college degree**. Whether it's navigating mental health, identity development, personal or medical concerns, Iowa State University has resources and support available to assist students with overcoming their individual obstacles. One of those resources is the **Office of Student Assistance** who through their work, coordinate the care and support students need for academic success and personal wellbeing. Specifically, their office follows up with students hospitalized for mental health crises, supports students and bystanders navigating loss and its intersection with their role as a student, and facilitates response when an ISU student dies.

Student Assistance has a **Crisis and Program Enhancement Fund** which was started by a gift from Paul and Lisa Niebuhr after their son Evan died in an auto accident. Any giving received during this campaign would be used by the Student Assistance team via this fund to enhance services to students/families in a variety of ways. Specifically, targeted outreach and support to some students navigating significant challenges, follow up with those students, and creating resources otherwise not available given funding parameters at Iowa State.
