Message from Pastor Mary

July tilts us toward the second half of the year. It's a good moment to pause and ask ourselves how we are doing with our resolutions, our intentions and our hopes and dreams? Are we living the life we believe God is calling us to live? Are we loving in the way that God asks us to love? Are we connecting with our friends and families in the way that makes for a healthy mind and a healthy heart? I think these are the good questions for July. It is like taking a little check-up and seeing how we are doing in the walk with Jesus.

During the month of June my husband and I took a trip to Mesa Verde and the Grand Canyon. At Mesa Verde we climbed down into "Cliff Palace" and saw how people a thousand years ago lived in the high desert and bluffs of southern Colorado. We took a "loooong" hike that had us scrambling over boulders, drinking several liters of water, and finally coming to the place of ancient

petroglyphs. At the Grand Canyon, we peered into the layers of geological history. When we saw the wild horses or the elk with their calves, I think God was asking us to pause and deeply appreciate life itself. In all of this travel, I believe I was invited to look again at where I stand, and ask questions of attention and intention at the mid-point of the year.

So, as July tilts us forward, I invite you, too, to take stock and to ask the questions God might ask you. What and who do you love? What shows you the grace and mystery that makes your heart sing? What is God inviting you to be a part of now and in the months ahead.




