

Message from Pastor Mary

Living God, grant us the grace of true vision so we may serve your people: that the Good News is heard each day, lived in our locality, bringing your healing and justice. For the sake of your kin-dom on earth. Amen. (from the lona Community)

There are two items of particular note I would like to call your attention to: the first is the Fireside Renovation Project. Under the leadership of Linda Carver, Team Leader, a group has been commissioned by the Trustees to renovate the Fireside Room. A grant was procured from the Endowment Board. Team members include: Mary Jo and Jon Banwart, John and Jane Jacobson, Janelle Keltgen, and Pastor Mary. The target date for the big reveal is Oct. 29th. In the meantime, we are refurbishing the Conference Room across the hall from the Fireside Room. It is equipped with a large screen, whiteboard and new carpeting. A new table is being ordered. All meetings will occur in the



Conference Room until the Fireside Room is complete. Study and Fellowship groups may use the Conference Room or the Gathering Space.

Secondly, you will soon receive information from the Church Council regarding next steps in visioning and implementing financial sustainability and ministry for the 21st century here at Collegiate/Wesley. This is a process we are all entering and as we go forward, information will be shared with the congregation every step of the way. There are many different possibilities for the use of our property and assets, including the house next door as an intentional student community. The Church Council will be releasing its decisions on next steps after a special retreat in July to consider all the options and weigh survey results.

As we turn our thoughts toward the fall, we prepare for the students arriving and returning to ISU, for our kick off Sunday on September 10th and for the many ways our fellowship flourishes as we come back into our study groups, our service opportunities, our fellowship with each other and our full worship with our choir. August is an important month because it is the hinge between the summer and the fall; August has sometimes been called, "the dog days of summer' because it is often hot and the time seems to move slowly, but, in reality, August brims with preparation and vision.

Here are some of the exciting learning opportunities coming this fall that are in preparation:

Disciple Bible Study - new app version; meeting on Zoom. Contact Pastor Mary

Reading and Conversation – led by Lauren Loonsfoot, this group usually meets at Dog Eared Books. Some of their studies include racial reconciliation and allyship.

The M&M Sunday Group – led by Lynn Kaizer at 9 am, this group does studies of theology and scripture and the practical implications on our lives. Conference Room (across from the Fireside Room)

Spiritual Formation – led by Mike King at 9 am on Sunday mornings, this group often follows the scripture and worship themes. Library

The Builders Class – led by Barb Pedersen at 9 am on Sunday mornings, this is a conversational group that deals with current events. Room 44

Faith Formations – led by Mary Jean Baker, this group is an online learning experience where you read and comment in a group email thread.

The Forum Class – facilitated by Tim Garner, this class meets occasionally to bring speakers and information regarding important issues in our community. **Norman Room**

Roundtable – facilitated by Bev Kruempel and led by Pastor Mary, this group meets the 2nd Thursday of the month at noon on Zoom. This group reads a book a few chapters each month for discussion. The book that begins the series is: "All We Can Save: Truth, Courage and Solutions for the Climate Crisis" by Ayana Johnson and Katherine Wilkerson

Northcrest Bible Study -led by Pastor Mary this group meets at Northcrest in the Green Room every other Wednesday at 1:15 pm and follows curriculum we choose as a group. Sample of what we have studied: Nones; Adam Hamilton on The Lord's Prayer; Amy Jill Levine, Difficult Words of Jesus. All are welcome

Green Hills Tuesday Group – led by Pastor Mary, this group meets once a month in the Pine Room at Green Hills. We are just finishing Leslie Weatherhead's "The Will of God"

Campus Wesley Foundation Groups - led by Pastor Lewis on Wednesday evening

Our Director of Music, Patrick Gagnon will be announcing bell choir rehearsals for the various bell choirs, Chancel Choir will resume in September on Wednesday evening and Alex Jean will lead children's choir on Sunday mornings.

We also will enjoy some fellowship groups:

Roots and Values – led by Darra Johnson, this group will gather to explore the values that people were raised with on farm communities and in rural America. Times TBA

Women's Koinonia Group – Wednesday at 7 pm in the Gathering Space. We use a devotional book to prompt our discussions

Men's Coffee Fellowship – Wednesday at 9 am in the Gathering Space. Coffee and donuts provided

Middle School Youth Fellowship - Wednesday at 6 pm in the Youth Room led by Lauren Loonsfoot **High School Youth Fellowship** - Wednesday at 7 pm in the Youth Room led by Lauren Loonsfoot

We also will be enjoying some special programing and worship:

September 17th -we welcome Missionary Kathrine Parker from Nepal to our Pulpit and for a learning opportunity before worship

October – a special program of Storytelling is being shaped and more information will be forthcoming! Pastor Lewis is organizing this and it is going to be great!

We have had a terrific summer here at Collegiate/Wesley and I hope you will plan to join us for worship on Sunday mornings at 10, join a Sunday School class starting September 10th available for children and youth at 8:45 am and adults at 9:00 am on Sunday and consider plugging into one of our learning or fellowship opportunities.
