

Endowment Board

CW Endowment Board Awards \$14,218

Each year the Collegiate Wesley Endowment Board awards funds to missions, programs and /or capital **improvements that support CW's vision and purpose.** The available funds are calculated by averaging the Fund year end balances for the last five years (2018-2022) and then designating 5% of the average to be distributed during 2023. The money is separate from the CW budget and cannot be used for any on-going expenses. This year the Endowment Board had \$83,030 available for grants. In April the Board disbursed \$68,812 to twelve different projects. At the August Board meeting the remaining 2023 funds were awarded. The recipients and their sponsoring CW committee/council/board are

- \$ 3000 Clothing That Works (Sending to Serve)
- \$ 630 Wesley Foundation Fall Retreat with Katherine Parker (Wesley Foundation)
- \$ 850 CulturALL Workshop sponsored by Church Council
- \$ 2000 Additional funds for Little Food Pantry (Sending to Serve)
- \$ 675 Additional funds for more stickers and magnets to promote CW (Reaching & Receiving)
- \$ 675 Additional funds to provide bleed kits with the new AEDs. (Trustees)
- \$ 6388 Additional funds to support redecorating the Fireside Room (Trustees)
