

As we continue our Lenten journey through the month of March, we practice that spiritual discipline of letting go of what keeps us from feeling grounded in God's love and taking up new pathways into fellowship, service and a witness of prayer for the world. This month we make our way with Jesus to Jerusalem through the parade of Palm Sunday to the table of the Last Supper of Maundy Thursday, to the shadow of the cross on Good Friday, and finally to the triumph recognition of our new life as we celebrate the Resurrection. This journey is more than a recitation of ritual that we enact each year. Rather, it is an invitation to each of us to take part in the commitment of the sacrificial life and the life of love that can never be



extinguished and which grants us so much: it delivers new friends, new possibilities, new ways of seeing old things and new attributes like courage and generosity and gratitude for God's presence in our lives and the world. It is all this that we step into as we take the Lenten journey.

In Ted Loder's prayer, he asks to be given the openness to risk "something genuinely new." I think that is a powerful prayer for our Lenten season. What shall we risk to live in new ways? What is calling to you on your journey: something to learn, something to give, something to practice? In a world where there is so much stress and strain, may we be ambassadors of bringing new hope, new expressions of love and new commitments to peace and justice.

During the next few weeks, many will be preparing to travel for Spring break. I hope as a community here at Collegiate/Wesley we can think about Spring break as a week to reclaim ourselves as vibrant people living rich and full lives. And then bring that recovered awareness and energy into our life together as we continue toward Easter Sunday.

May each of you feel the presence of God in the center of your life.

The Forum Sunday School class will host William Stodden, director of **Good Neighbor Emergency Assistance**, on Sunday, March 10, 9:00am (until 9:50) in the Norman Room. Mr. Stodden will speak on his organization's mission, as well as food and shelter insecurity in our county. All are welcome to attend this presentation.

About GNEA: Good Neighbor Emergency Assistance has been serving people in Ames and Story County for more than 25 years. Initially founded by many local faith communities, GNEA now also works closely with the United Way, The City of Ames and other Story County cities, ISU and the County to provide assistance designed to prevent homelessness. Our main services include rent, utility, emergency food and transportation assistance, and we also have a Navigator on-site to help direct people to more sustainable options and to assist in getting those who are eligible signed up for SNAP, CIRHA, LIHEAP, and Social Security.

Amen.



Wow! What a change in weather we have had! We went from nearly 2' of snow and -20 all the way to 60 degrees and some hints of green! Some of the flowers in the courtyard are even trying to peek out!

Speaking of things that are green, this last month we completed some more "green" updates! Scaffolding was brought in to replace the old fluorescent lighting that was starting to have issues in the North and South staircases. Not only does this brighten things up and increases safety on the stairs, it also helps us reduce our electrical usage. Over the time I've been here, we have been able to reduce our budget for utilities every year. We used 80% of our utilities budget at the church, and 87% of our budget at the annex. This is with us continuing to reduce the utilities budget! Our electricity at the Annex has now been reduced enough to get us a lower rate!

As spring comes around, take some time to enjoy the weather and give thanks for nature.





Endowment Board

The 2024 Endowment Grant Application cycle has begun. The deadline for submitting applications to the Endowment Board is March 31. Grant applications will be reviewed during the Endowment Board April meeting. Five percent of the average year end Fund balance for the previous five years is allocated to support approved projects. For 2024, \$86,547 is available for grants.

Endowment grant funds are available for use for:

- Capital expenditures on behalf of, or in the name of, the Collegiate United Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation, Ames, Iowa, for real property acquisitions, repairs or improvements; or
- Funding or helping to fund new or existing programs to be administered or sponsored by the Collegiate United Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation, Ames, Iowa; or
- Benevolences endorsed, supported or approved by the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

This may be one opportunity to help achieve **some of the church's** goals, such as enhancing the ministries or programs of C/W or for capital expenditures. You should also be aware that the application process requires applicants to engage the support of an appropriate C/W cluster or group to sponsor their projects. If the proposal requires space or capital commitments, applicants are asked to review their proposal with the Board of Trustees. These actions help to ensure the projects align with church priorities.


