## Message from Pastor Mary

"Now may the sound of the genuine in you stir anew, that you would stay near enough to yourself to decipher the truth of who you are -- what you crave, how you communicate, how you love, what you're afraid of -- and when it's safe and right, choose to unmask. As you rise to meet your own face, may you be at rest. May it be so." Cole Arthur Riley <u>Black Liturgies</u>, ©2024

When you are experiencing what is genuine in you do you know it? I think **most of us do: what we like, what we don't like, what we feel is right or** wrong, what moves us or leaves us cold. Most of us can experience what is genuine in us, or usually in others, and let that teach us about relationships, life, faith and God. In the years I worked as a therapist, there was a condition I would see sometimes, wherein a person did not know what they **felt, what they believed, or what they liked or didn't like. They had been** 



raised without any support in naming and confirming their own personal proclivities. Sometimes it took months, if not years, to help people find their own voice. But when they did have a voice that they named and owned as their own, there was a great sense of joy, empowerment, and confidence.

When we walk into the world with our faith intact, and our relationship with Jesus continually nourished, we are much more likely to know what is genuine in ourselves and others. Because there is something planted within us that says "I am called to be myself and to be loved" and when we keep that part protected and strong, we can also say, "I see you" to other people. This is the nub of relationship: to relate in our mutual authenticity, to belong to one another and to belong to oneself.

As we move into April at Collegiate/Wesley, we emerge from Easter as authentic people seeking to share **God's love and vision for justice with the world. We seek to be "at rest" or certain about our identities as** beloved people of God reaching out in inclusive love to all. At Collegiate/Wesley, all does mean all. There is no equivocation.

I hope you will join us in worship this April, in person or online. We will be celebrating the baptism of Lucia Wolff, daughter of Ted and Maren on April 21<sup>st</sup>. We will be following the Revised Common Lectionary for the weeks after Easter throughout the month of April. So we will journey with Thomas **through his doubt, the bewilderment of the followers after Jesus' death and resurrection, the sacrificial** life described in the person of the Good Shepherd and the vine that connects us all in the vineyard of God.

May we gather, knowing that our communion with one another strengthens and helps us.




#### Summer Service Trips

So far we have raised \$2911!



# Focus On: Clothing That Works

#### CTW is open Wednesdays, 2-5pm and the first Saturday of each month, 9am-noon.

- The number of people served from July 26, 2023 January 31, 2024: 1612 (this is an average of 54 people per open day). Last year's average from June 4, 2022 to July 1, 2023 was 37 per open day.
- Clothing That Works is on the 3rd floor of the Annex. If we have any knowledge of physically disabled people, we figure out a way to help them choose clothing.
- Clothing That Works operates on donations from the public, including both clothes and money. We have received monies from the Byrne Fund and CUMCWF's Endowment Fund.



- In the past year we have used our money to buy underwear, jeans, towels, winter coats, gloves and hats.
- CTW continues to get free bras and few other items from a charity called Support the Girls.
- In 2023 we received 3000 pairs of Bomba socks. We are on the calendar to get another 3000 pairs this summer.
- The LOFT of Ames donates clothing four/five times a year.
- St. Cecilia Church had an underwear drive for CTW in summer 2023 and Northcrest Community had a coat drive for CTW in the fall of 2023.
- We continue to recycle unusable shoes and jeans with the Zappos recycling program. Our unusable tennis shoes go to Got Sneakers for recycling. One Vision, a recycling program from Clear Lake, has been taking our unusable clothing. The best thing about this company is they come to the Annex every other week to collect the clothes.
- CTW discontinued taking donations at the church. This was too much work for our volunteers. Donations should be taken directly to CTW on the days/times that they are open.
- We have a great core of volunteers: Megan Fairall, Barb Pederson, LeAnn Meehan, Julie Voss, Bonnie Trede, Kim Gawley, Karen Klaiber, Fran Berger, Elaine Johnson, Janell Eby, and Cathy Halverson.
